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ABOUT BRAIN TUMOURS

- Brain cancer is responsible for the most cancer deaths in children and young people under the age of 40.
- Brain cancer is the biggest cancer killer of children in New Zealand, being responsible for 42% of all childhood cancer deaths (almost double that of leukaemia).
- In 2021, 413 New Zealanders were diagnosed with primary brain cancer, representing 1.4% of all cancers diagnosed in New Zealand.
- Around 260 New Zealanders die each year from brain cancer the 10th most fatal cancer.
- Survival rates for brain cancer have not improved significantly in the last 30 years. The 5 year survival rate for glioblastoma, the most common type of brain cancer, is just 5%.
- Brain tumours can affect anyone, of any ethnicity, and at any age. The causes of most brain tumours are unknown which means there are no preventative measures and population screening is impractical.
